INTERFAITH COUNCIL OF METROPOLITAN WASHINGTON SPEAKS OUT AGAINST RISING ANTI-SEMITISM

The Interfaith Council of Metropolitan Washington, which includes 11 historic faith traditions, denounces the recent rise in anti-Semitism both here in the Capital region and across the country. We call on people of all faiths (and of no particular faith) to treat one another in such a way that all people in our region will feel welcomed, respected, and appreciated. This includes respecting our Jewish friends and neighbors who, like all Americans, have the right to be their authentic selves in this nation and to worship freely without fear of violence.

Over the past few years, the United States has seen a rise in anti-Semitism (as seen here). The mass shooting in 2018 at the Tree of Life Synagogue in Pittsburgh drew national condemnation, and rightly so. Beyond such a tragedy, though, we as a nation have seen anti-Semitic hatred, violence, and intimidation take on many forms. Sometimes that means an attack on public transit, as in New York last year. Sometimes that means disturbing virtual encounters, as in Northern Virginia during the pandemic. The Mid-Atlantic region we call home has seen an especially large jump in anti-Semitic attacks over the past year, nearly doubling in Virginia (and more than doubling in D.C. and Maryland). We at the Interfaith Council believe that all people are possessed of inherent dignity and worth, and deserve to be treated as such. Today, we stand in solidarity with our Jewish members, friends, and neighbors in particular, calling for an end to anti-Semitic hatred and violence in all forms.

We at the IFC cannot help but note that this most recent spike in anti-Semitism has happened at the same time as the recent conflict in Israel and Gaza has unfolded (as seen here). Like any large group of Americans, the members of the Interfaith Council are not of one mind about how best to resolve the situation in the Middle East. Real differences of opinion exist within our faith traditions and among them, including the Jewish community itself. Even so, we are united in our belief that political differences -- even sharp differences -- must not result in neighbors attacking neighbors because of their religious and spiritual beliefs.

Given the current spike in violence against members of the Jewish community, we are speaking out at this time in particular, calling for an end to anti-Semitism. We invite everyone in our region to stand in solidarity with our neighbors of all faiths, especially the Jewish community right now, so that the dignity of every individual and the freedom of each house of worship may be respected and celebrated.
